Motivation

- Indian health care scenario is at best complex. Probably India is the only country where we have a whole range of health care related issues are important and prevalent. The spectrum of issues ranged from safe motherhood, control of communicable disease and life style diseases.
- The health care delivery mechanisms varied from project orientation, subsidized governmental health care delivery systems (primary health care centers, district hospitals, state hospitals), health care systems managed by non-profit and trust based organizations, and hospitals managed by professional enterprises.
- The cost of health care in India is rapidly increasing and the trend is likely to continue.
- The health insurance sector is slowly evolving and is likely to stabilize soon. The implications of the evolution of health insurance sector to the health care cost, service quality and portfolio of services offered by hospitals is unclear.
- The managerial effectiveness of various health care delivery mechanisms also varied.
- Health care policy is not well articulated. Periodic changes do happen.
- The supporting infrastructure like health care professionals, Para-medicals, etc. are in the process of developing.
- The pharmaceutical industry is going through a major structural change.
- The health care systems are continuously and routinely investing on new equipment and technology.
- Health care systems are part of a larger agenda of sustainable human development.
- In essence, health care policy, health care delivery mechanisms, the infrastructure, and the managerial effectiveness are in a continuous state of evolution.

Objectives

This is a comprehensive health care consultation in India covering a wide range of issues concerning health care in India with an objective to increase the interaction between academicians, practitioners, administrators and members of industries associated and involved with health care.

- A Forum for discussion related to health policy and its implementation

- To provide a benchmark to improve operational effectiveness on service quality

- Research and advances in pharmaceuticals industries and medical devices: A comprehensive view of the emerging trends in the pharmaceutical industry, interfaces between growth and pharmaceutical industry and cost of health care, technological advancements related to procedures and medical devices, cost of pharmaceutical products, role of regulators.
- Information and communication technology applications: The enabling role of information technology in health care delivery, hospital information systems, tele-medicine, medical record systems, effective use of new technology in delivering quality health care.
- Medical Insurance: Emerging trends, policy options, implications to cost of health care delivery.
- Community development and health care, millennium development goals and implications to health sector in India.
- Population control and management.

Invited Speakers:

Several invited sessions are planned by top policy makers of Government of India, State Governments, leading academicians from well known medical colleges, large teaching hospitals, representatives of national and international institutions connected with health care, non-governmental agencies, representatives of international health care institutions, senior management from pharmaceutical, insurance and medical devices industry.
